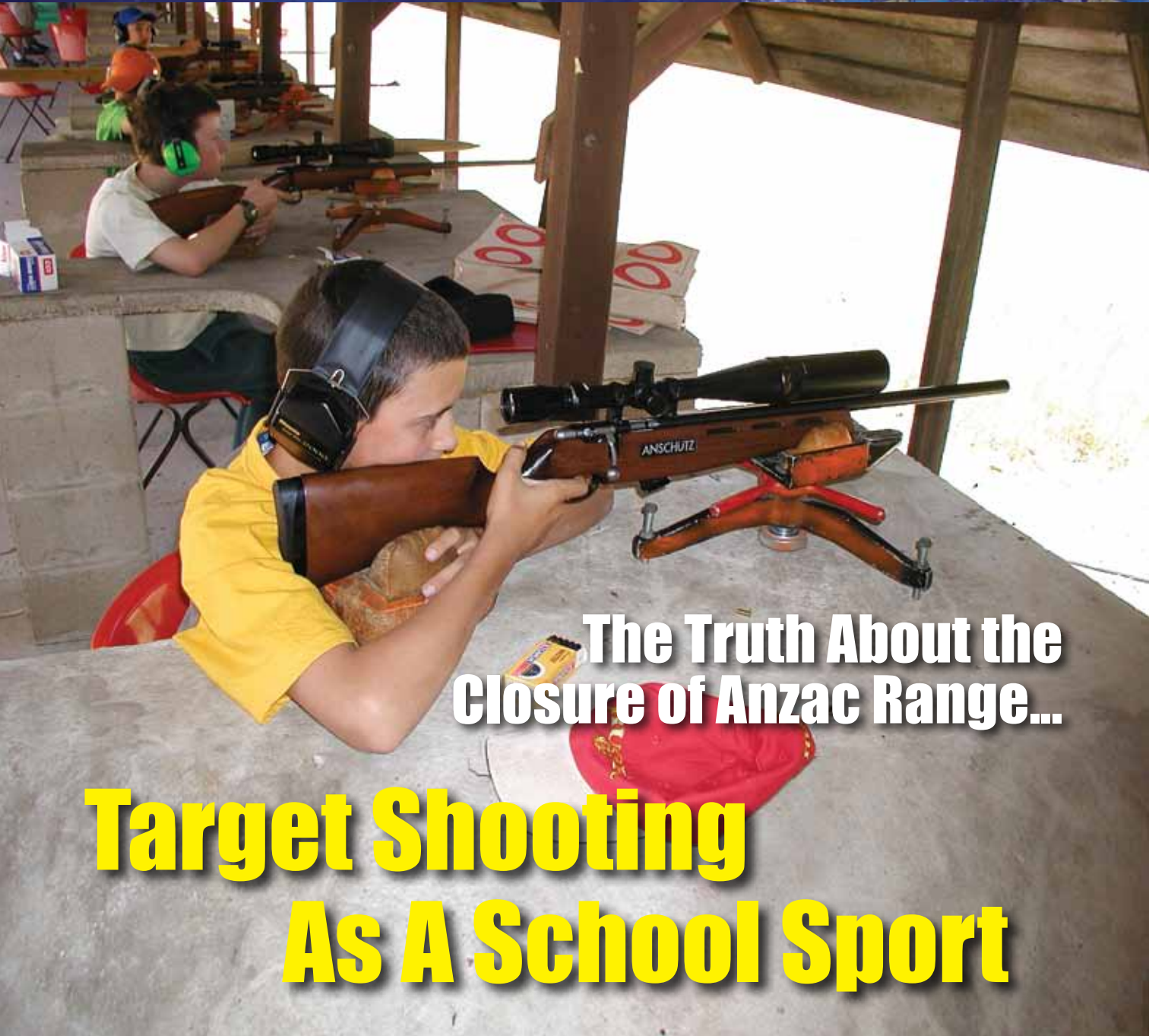

The Truth About the Closure of Anzac Range...

Recently the **SSAA NSW Board** made the very difficult decision to stop access to the SSAA facility at the ANZAC Rifle Range at Malabar.

This decision was not taken lightly.

- A Termination Notice was issued by the Commonwealth Government to SSAA NSW, the Licence holder, with the effect that our access to the Rifle Range would cease on 31st October 2011.
- A letter received from Federal Minister Gary Gray stated that "Persons who enter and use the site... may be exposed to health risks due to inhalation of airborne asbestos particles from broken asbestos sheeting and pipes throughout the site and within buildings on the site".
- The letter also stated that "Finance is unable to provide assurance as to whether or not the site is safe to use".
- SSAA NSW received legal advice recommending that SSAA NSW ought to terminate the use of the range by its members immediately as the letters from the Government increase our potential risk of liability.
- SSAA NSW also received confirmation from the SSAA Insurance Broker that there is, and always has been an exclusion for Asbestos in both the Public Liability

and Associations Liability (Directors & Office Bearers insurance) policies.

- SSAA NSW has been advised that a duty of care has now been clearly identified and indeed exists and there is no insurance coverage for any asbestos related event.
- The Secretary of SSAA Sydney Branch recently requested that the Licence be transferred. Under the terms of the Licence SSAA NSW is unable to transfer the Licence to SSAA Sydney Branch. This could only be done with Commonwealth Government approval and they have said NO.

This latest development does not mean that SSAA NSW is giving up the fight, far from it – we will continue to work closely with SSAA Sydney Branch in campaigning for the shooters of ANZAC Range and the shooters of NSW so that the range may be reopened after appropriate remediation work is done by the Commonwealth and/or State Governments.

It is important that we continue to adopt a united approach and stick to our agreed strategy, as multiple agendas, mixed messages and internal disputes will endanger our likelihood of a successful outcome.

Target Shooting As A School Sport

It will come as no surprise to many shooters that shooting is already available as an elective sport in some schools. Sydney Boys High School, for example, introduced shooting as a school sport in 1883. The recent media coverage of shooting as a school sport is pretty much a beatup, implying that children will be inculcated with an American 'gun culture' if Shooters and Fishers Party MLCs Robert Brown and I are successful in changing the administrative procedures a school must follow when adopting shooting as a sport. Nothing could be further from the truth: shooting is a sport that inculcates responsibility, discipline and teaches a culture of the safe use of firearms.

The future of the shooting sports depends on our ability to educate and encourage young people to participate and I want to see as many Junior programs running as possible. At the moment schools that wish to introduce shooting as a school sport face several hurdles, including the development of specific guidelines that must be approved by the principal of the school, the Regional Director and the Minister for Education. The best way to remove some of those hurdles is to include a set of guidelines for the conduct of target shooting as a school sport in the Education Department's "Guidelines for the Safe Conduct of Sport and Physical Activity in Schools.

The Departmental Guidelines for the conduct of sport in schools are a resource available on the Department's website, to provide guidance for teachers and principals wishing to introduce a particular sport in their school. The guidelines reduce the workload of the Department by removing the need to liaise with each individual school wishing to introduce a new sport, while ensuring that minimum standards are followed in each school. The Guidelines set standards on such matters as supervision of students, provision of suitable equipment and its maintenance, and any other safety or legal issues relevant to that sport.

Currently there are no guidelines for target shooting included in that document, and all schools wishing to offer target shooting as a sport are obliged to make specific application to the Department, through their Regional Director. SFP MLCs have been approached by a number of shooting clubs in contact with schools interested in conducting target shooting as a sport and in 2008 my predecessor, the Hon. Roy Smith approached the then Minister for Education, Ms Verity Firth, regarding the inclusion of Target Shooting in the Guidelines. Draft Guidelines were negotiated with the Department, however at the last minute political interference lead to the insertion into the draft Guidelines of a couple of requirements that did not apply to any other sport, so the matter was dropped. I will be raising it with the current Government in the near future.

In the meantime, I have a Bill currently before the Legislative Council that proposes amendments to the Firearms Act to allow persons under 18 to shoot air-rifles under supervision at approved ranges, and to remove the need to register air-rifles owned by a person holding a category A firearms licence. Air-rifles are a good way of introducing youngsters to shooting, and passage of these amendments could make it easier for clubs to work with local schools to provide opportunities for shooting as a school sport.

Oberon's Tom Coulter had a great weekend taking out Top Gun, Top Male, First for Modern Sights and the Speed Pistol match.

Top Lady was won by Merriwa's Jill Martyn who also won the Long Range event with Modern sights at a distance of 70 metres.

Danica Roberts won the Top Junior medal and also come 3rd in the Rimfire class, just nipping at the heels of her



mother Alison Hughes. Ralph Imber from Sydney was 1st with Traditional Sights and also took out the Long Range Traditional Sights class, shooting all the way to 100 metres. Don Barwick from Oberon won speed loading/unloading competition.
